About the Arden

Founded in 1988, Arden Theatre Company is a professional regional theatre offering the highest quality theatrical productions and educational programs to the artists, audiences, and students of Greater Philadelphia. Each year, we produce the Mainstage season and Arden Children's Theatre, the city's first resident children's theatre. From our productions that reach over 100,000 audience members each year to our educational outreach programs that inspire and empower 6,000 students in schools across our region, the Arden stands out as a haven for shared stories and a vital incubator to create new work.

The Arden has been an important force behind the vitality of the Old City neighborhood and in the Philadelphia cultural landscape. In our last complete season, 2018 / 2019, the Arden produced seven Mainstage and two Arden Children's Theatre productions, resulting in 503 performances seen by more than 107,000 people.

Mission

Arden Theatre Company is dedicated to bringing to life great stories by great storytellers on the stage, in the classroom, and in the community.

Great stories on the stage: We produce a wide range of stories in a variety of styles: classic and contemporary, intimate and epic, fiction and nonfiction, musical and dramatic. Producing the great playwrights allows us to measure ourselves against the masters of our craft while sharing the voices of new writers gives us the opportunity to shape the future of American theatre. We embrace stories for audiences of all ages and bring the same artistic quality to all our work.

Great stories in the classroom: Kids are celebrated at the Arden. We nurture curiosity, creativity, and confidence through our educational programming. We foster connections between theatre and reading and promote literacy for our young audiences. We reach thousands of students each year, introducing many of our region's kids to theatre for the first time.

Great stories in the community: We believe in the power of stories to bring people together. We work to build a vital community of artists who excel creatively through shared experiences and with whom our audiences identify. The Arden strives to be Philadelphia's hometown theatre; we seek community partnerships and collaborations, make our work affordable and accessible, and train the next generation of theatre leaders, contributing to the region's cultural landscape.

Position Summary

Arden Theatre Company's Manager of Institutional Giving is responsible for overseeing the strategy and execution of the company's institutional donors (foundation, corporate, government). The Manager must write and submit accurate and timely grant proposals and reports, ensure compliance with funding guidelines, and oversee institutional donor cultivation and stewardship. In this deadline-driven role, the Manager is expected to proactively seek opportunities to generate proposals based on corporate and foundation interest that will result in funding for the immediate and long terms goals of the Arden.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

- Responsible for executing the annual fundraising plan for Foundation, Government, and Corporate solicitations.
- Oversees and maintains an institutional giving calendar and leads in the execution of fundraising strategies for all foundation, corporate, and government funders
- Responsible for writing, editing, and submitting grant applications and proposals, reports, and evaluation documents
- Responsible for setting, tracking, and achieving an annual institutional giving revenue goal of ~\$1.5 million
- Primary relationship manager for Foundation, Government, and Corporate contacts; provides cultivation and stewardship and maintains accurate contact and solicitation records in AudienceView (database)
- Provides stewardship to current donors and build relationships between the theatre and its grant making prospects and contacts
- Actively seeks opportunities for new institutional support; conducts prospect research, and maintains prospect/donor databases and records
- Provides support and logistical assistance for fundraising and cultivation events to include the creation and maintenance of institutional funders RSVP list
- Manages income and expenses for grant and sponsorship-related activities
- Assists with writing and editing departmental and company-related collateral, as needed
- With the Development Team, provides donor concierge services and onsite Development presence at performances
- With the Development Team supports the organization's fundraising and donor cultivation and appreciation events, paying particular attention to events associated most closely with assigned portfolio
- With the Development Team, supports other donor cultivation and engagement events throughout the year as needed, including cultivation and stewardship receptions/dinners, trips, etc.

Preferred Experience & Qualifications

Successful candidates will bring:

- At least three years of fundraising experience with an emphasis on writing grant and sponsorship proposals
- Demonstrated success in winning support from foundation, corporate, and government donors
- Superior writing and editing skills, including knowledge of grammar and various writing styles
- Excellent computer skills, especially Microsoft 365
- An understanding of fundraising systems and how data can be used to manage the fundraising process, enhance donor cultivation and drive fundraising priorities
- Experience with Constituent Relationship Management or Database software, especially AudienceView
- Experience in using research resources for identifying funding prospects and opportunities
- Knowledge of local community and major donors in the region

Preferred Competencies & Qualities

Successful candidates will:

- Have good judgment, strong decision-making skills, and able to work with minimum supervision
- Demonstrate diplomacy, tact, and professionalism
- Be a goal-oriented strategic thinker; Take initiative, show creativity and a collaborative spirit
- Be calm under pressure and skilled at multitasking and managing competing priorities
- Be comfortable in a fast-paced environment; flexibility is key
- Be a team player—rolling up your sleeves must be a favored tactic
- Be able and willing to work a flexible schedule, which will include some nights and weekends
- Have a passion for theatre and in the Philadelphia cultural community with a genuine interest in becoming a driver of the Arden's mission and vision
